From February 10th to March 10th nearly 3,000 people participated in our survey; over 2,300 at electronic survey kiosks that were taken to locations across city neighbourhoods, over 400 did the survey online, and many many others submitted the paper version to us. Thanks!

“Sustain-a-bucks”
